Am one of the many school program drop outs from Children Of Uganda organisation . I don't have any profession am fully qualified in, be it motor vehicle mechanics or anything. I am willing to act as a chauffeur if empowered.

Maybe if I can learn how to earn and stand on my own, maybe people will treat me like a human being too! I only own two shirts and trousers and rubber sandals that were given to me last December by Irene who is another total orphan that got a chance to be empowered and loved by Uncle Mike Openshaw.

Please help me, give me guidance, empower me such that I may be able to sustain myself with the basics of life and to help my other sisters and brothers, the true children of Sister Rose the late.
